A special thanks also to the professionals who competed in the Short Game Challenge at the PGA Show along-side the Equipment Testing Center. The Met PGA was rewarded with a 2nd place finish on Thursday that earned us \$1,500.00. In all, 15 of our professionals took the time to enter and compete.

January Schedule of Winter Championships Features Senior Events

The PGA Winter Championships have moved through January with the completion of the Quarter Century Championship, the Senior Stroke Play and the Senior-Junior Championship. Events are presented this year by Golf Advisor, Premier Golf and GOLFADVISOR.

In the Quarter Century Championship only five Met PGA Members were able to cash a check in the first event of the Winter Championships. Sleepy Hollow's David Young tied for 5th place in Group 1 while Dan Tzivanis of Rolling Hills and Pelham's Mike Diffley tied for 10th place in Group 2 and Old Oaks' Bobby Heins was tied for 7th in Group 3. Among the more senior professionals in the Groups 4-9, only Mal Galletta Jr. of Engineers was able to earn a payday with a tie for 8th place in Group 5.

In the Senior Stroke Play, the Met PGA made a stronger impression, highlighted by several top finishes. In Group 1 (50-54) Craig Thomas of Metropolis (9th) cashed a check while in Group 2, Pelham's Mike Diffley was runner-up with rounds of 72-73-67. Bruce Zabriski of Westchester CC also cashed a check in a tie for 10th. In Group 3, Bobby Heins also enjoyed a runner-up finish with rounds of 67-65-71 as the top 4 finishers were all Met Section alum (Mike San Filippo 1st), Kevin Morris (3rd) and Jerry Impellittiere (4th). In Group 5, Mal Galletta Jr. and Bob Dickson shared the honors as the low finishers with 213 totals and Galletta firing rounds of 72-72-69. Our final player to notch a paycheck was Bob Joyce in 5th place in Group 6 (75-79).

The Senior-Junior Championship has normally been dominated by the Met Section and while 2015 produced a Met PGA winner only six professionals finished in the money., including the 2015 Champion Colin Amaral of Metropolis who teamed with South Florida's Lee Rinker to post rounds of 64-66-65-65 260 and win by a stroke at 28 under par. Charlie Meola of Saxon Woods teamed with former Met PGA Professional Jerry Impellittiere to finish in a tie for 8th place while Tam O'Shanter's Mark Brown partnered with Jeff Coston of New England in 10th place. The team of Dan Tzivanis of Rolling Hills and Pete Catanzaro of Scarsdale were in a tie for 20th place, along with the team of Ryan Kalista of Tamarack and his partner Pete Oakley of Palm City, Florida.

PGA Financial Assistance Fund Scholarship Program Deadline is March 15th

PGA Members with children (or grandchildren) in their senior year of high school or in college may apply for these academic based scholarships from the PGA of America's Financial Assistance Fund. Students must carry a 3.4 GPA as well as including their other activities and their transcript with the Scholarship Application. Again in 2015, 20% of the funding will take into account financial need and beginning with last year's 2014 graduating high school seniors (incoming freshman in the Fall of 2014), the total number of scholarships a student can receive will be limited to 2 total scholarships over the 4 years of undergraduate college attendance.
