Section V — Conditions of Competition

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

All players shall abide by the USGA Rules of Golf and all subsequent "Conditions of the Competition." listed below:

<u>List of Conforming Driver Heads</u>

Any driver the player carries must have a club head, identified by model and loft, that is named on the current List of Conforming Driver Heads issued by the USGA.

Exception: A driver with a club head that was manufactured prior to 1999 is exempt from this condition.

Form and Make of Clubs

The player's clubs must conform to the groove and punch mark specification in the Rules of Golf that are effective from January 1, 2010. (see 4-1/1)

List of Conforming Golf Balls

The ball the player plays must be named on the current List of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the United States Golf Association.

Pace of Play

Rule 6-7 will be enforced. (See Pace of Play Policy).

Discontinuance and Resumption of Play

The committee shall have the authority to delay, postpone, suspend or cancel play when weather or course conditions prevent play. Additionally, when darkness prevents completion of a round it shall be considered suspended and resumed the next day if possible. Every effort will be made to complete or reschedule the round. Professionals should be aware that rescheduling may necessitate extending tournament dates.

Procedure When Play Suspended by Committee

When play is suspended by the Committee, if the players in a match or group are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they have started play of a hole, they may discontinue play immediately or continue play of the hole, provided they do so without delay. If the players choose to continue play of the hole, they are permitted to discontinue play before completing it. In any case, play must be discontinued after the hole is completed.

The players must resume play when the Committee has ordered a resumption of play.

Distance Measuring Devices

In all Met PGA events, a player may use a device to measure or gauge distance only (see the Note to Rule 14-3). However, if a distance-measuring device has additional functionality that can gauge or measure other conditions that might affect a player's play (e.g. elevation change, wind speed, etc.), the use of any such additional function would be a breach of Rule 14-3.

Etiquette Note: Players should ensure that any electronic device taken onto the course does not distract other players or us used in a way that breaches Rule 14-3.
